- drive economic growth through investment by life science industries









### NIHR Hub

- Revised Open Access policy launched 1<sup>st</sup> April
- NIHR has adopted "Gold" approach in line with RCUK and Wellcome Trust
- Revised policy at <u>http://www.nihr.ac.uk/research/Pages/Research\_Open\_Acce</u> <u>ss\_Policy\_Statement.aspx</u>
- Will be annual monitoring of the policy to measure compliance
