


Clinical Practice locations









- It is provided by Jisc in the UK (provider of the Janet network)
- Over 100 hospital sites with eduroam enabled in the UK



What is eduroam?



'eduroam - just connect'

- Network connectivity solution that works irrespective of the user's location -'just open your laptop and you're connected'
- Provides secure Wi-Fi connection and authentication using home organisation credentials
- Built on 802.1X provides for multiple network access security profiles
- Federated service, now available throughout nearly all higher education campuses in the UK
- Growing take up by research, FE, health service and others
- Available worldwide




Benefits of eduroam



- Free Wi-Fi for the user at huge number of locations through a single Wi-Fi profile
- Huge savings in time for both the individual and the service-providing organisation due to reduced guest account management
- Encourages inter-institution collaborative working
- Meet expectations of availability of eduroam and improve attractiveness of venue for conferences/meetings
- Enables network environments to be tailored to suit different security profiles of users and their devices dynamic VLAN assignment to differentiate managed devices, BYOD and user types
- Visitor remains "owned" by their home organisation

How eduroam works when the user roams



Note – the visited site provides the internet access, to a minimum agreed standard.

eduroam in NHS West Yorkshire

- Nine NHS Trusts
- Leeds THT is an extension of University "home"
- Eight Trusts implemented as a "visited" partner
- Trust signs up as eduroam partner independent of University
- Project funded by Health Education Yorkshire and Humber

eduroam in NHS West Yorkshire

Visited Sites

- Technical Consultant
- Trust provide Radius Authentication servers
- Authentication back to "home" organisation
- Trust provide Internet Connection
- Configuration of VLANS, DHCP etc.
- Trust signs up as an eduroam partner
