Old news

- CEPA-RIN report: 'Analysing the potential for collaborative purchasing of electronic subscriptions by NHS Education and higher education in Scotland.' (December 2012)
- Estimated overlap between journals in Health and Social Care acquired by HE institutions and those on a 'wish list' compiled by NHS Education for Scotland in 2010:
 - ≥50% across all institutions
 - ≥ 60% across institutions that have some sort of medical focus

So what are we doing about it?

- All funded by public money, but from different sources
- Scottish Higher Education Digital Library (SHEDL)
 (http://scurl.ac.uk/what-we-do/procurement/shedl/), a
 'super-consortial purchasing scheme' now has NHS
 Education for Scotland as a member of its Working
 Group, and we have participated in our first deal for journals from a publisher
- More deals under negotiation, which would be of potential interest

JISC Collections pilot NHS access 2014

- Journal content licensed for the academic research community is being made available to staff in the NHS in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland from April 2014
- AAAS, Annual Reviews, Elsevier, IOP Publishing, Nature Publishing Group, Oxford University Press, Springer, and Royal Society of Chemistry have agreed to provide a free trial access period for up to one year to some of their content
