National Library for Health

- 'The network is the library'
 - o Resolve to do some things once, but
 - o Avoid a centralist approach
 - o Users = all staff, students and patients
 - o Specific user offer National Service Framework
 - o Can be delivered by a range of suppliers

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Programme phases

- Phase 0 (March October 2004)
 - Vision, communication, consultation, TFPL

• Phase 1 (October 2004 – Summer 2005)

- New NHS wide services: document delivery; search engine; shared current awareness service
- Further consultation, baseline financial and user surveys
- Enhanced CPD

• Phase 2 (Summer 2005 -)

- Implement National Service Framework
- New Sale Costing for Health is delivering the National Programme for Information Technology
